# Pastor's Column November 22-23, 2014 On Being Judged and Being Thankful

This weekend as our liturgical year draws to a close, we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King. And our Gospel reading is Jesus' somewhat frightening description of the Last Judgment when he will return at the end of time and separate the good from the bad "as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats." To those who fail to make the grade he will say, "Depart from me, you accursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. [...] And these will go off to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life." Scary stuff to be sure. And then next week we celebrate the great civic and religious holiday of Thanksgiving when we see a softer side of our loving and merciful God and take time to thank Him for His abundant blessings. There are some who are quick to condemn who like to emphasize God's justice, while there are others who argue that God's infinite grace and mercy are such that He will exempt us from judgment. But God's mercy and judgment are intertwined and go hand in hand. Both are necessary and together show His great love for us.

Think of the analogy of a parent that exercises judgment towards a child who has disobeyed him or her. If the judgment or discipline is appropriate, we conclude that the parent used his or her judgment in a way that might produce good character in that child and help the child grow and mature. For example, if a child darts out into the street where traffic is heavy and dangerous, a mother or father would show their love in pulling the child away from the situation and teaching the child by punishing him or her with certain restrictions or loss of privileges in order to learn that their actions have consequences. While the child may not appreciate it at that moment, in time they may come to understand and be grateful for what their parent taught them.

God gives us laws and commands, not to enslave us, but to free us to be everything He created us to be. And we are created to be like Him, to love generously and freely by serving one another, especially those most in need. The Last Judgment in Matthew chapter 25 is one of the most vivid parables Jesus ever spoke and its meaning is clear. We will not be judged on the knowledge we have amassed, or the fame we have acquired, or the fortune we have gained, but rather according to our reaction to human need. We will be judged on the degree and quality of our love. And the more we are thankful for God's gifts and put those gifts to work by caring for others, the happier we ourselves will be. I recently saw a quote on Facebook that says it best: It is not happy people who are thankful; it is thankful people who are happy. Happy Thanksgiving, and Long Live Christ Our King! — Fr. Bob
