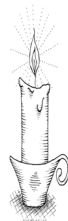

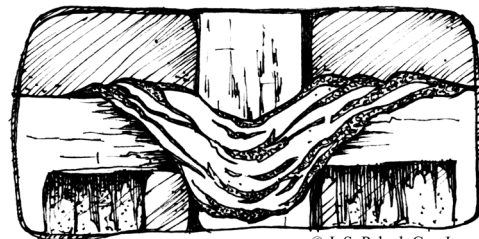

Pastor's Column June 14 – 15, 2014

Experiencing the Extraordinary in Ordinary Time

Our celebration of Pentecost last Sunday brought the Easter season to a close and we resumed what is known as Ordinary Time. But there is nothing ordinary about Ordinary Time, as it is in the routine moments of our daily lives that we come to know and experience God. And as if to emphasize that, these next three Sundays we celebrate three great Solemnities: the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity this weekend, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, also known as Corpus Christi next weekend, and the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, the two great Princes of the Apostles, the weekend after that. Our Triune God, Father Son and Holy Spirit, three Divine Persons in one God, is indeed a mystery not so much to be understood as it is to be embraced. God revealed Himself most fully through His only begotten Son, who became the visible image of the invisible God when He took on our human flesh in the womb of the Virgin Mary. And Jesus continues to be physically present to us in the great gift He instituted in the Eucharist, giving us His Body and Blood by the power of the Holy Spirit through the action of the Apostles and their successors (the bishops) and their assistants (the priests).

Next weekend we will give witness to our belief in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist with a traditional Corpus Christi procession through the streets of our neighborhood at the conclusion of the 12:30 PM Mass. The feast of Corpus Christi has as its origin a Eucharistic miracle. In the year 1263 a German priest, Peter of Prague, stopped at the town of Bolsena, Italy while on a pilgrimage to Rome. He is described as being a pious priest, but one who found it difficult to believe that Christ is actually present in the consecrated host. While celebrating Mass in the church of Santa Christina, Father Peter had barely spoken the words of consecration when blood started to seep from the Eucharist and trickle over his hands onto the altar and the corporal, the linen cloth upon which the gifts of bread and wine are transformed into Christ's body and blood at every Mass. Father Peter asked to be taken to Orvieto where Pope Urban IV was then residing. After listening to the priest's account, the Pope sent emissaries to Bolsena for an immediate investigation. When all the facts were ascertained, Pope Urban IV ordered the host and corporal bearing the stains of blood to be brought to Orvieto. With archbishops, cardinals and other Church dignitaries in attendance, the Pope met the procession and, amid great pomp, had the relics placed in the cathedral, where they continue to be reverently enshrined and venerated. He commissioned St. Thomas Aquinas to compose the Proper for a Mass, and one year after the miracle in 1264 Pope Urban IV issued a papal bull instituting the feast of Corpus Christi, which continues to be celebrated with grand Eucharistic processions in Orvieto and Bolsena in which I have had the great privilege to participate, as well as throughout the world. I urge you to join me in our own Eucharistic procession through the streets of Sheepshead Bay next Sunday. Fr. Bob

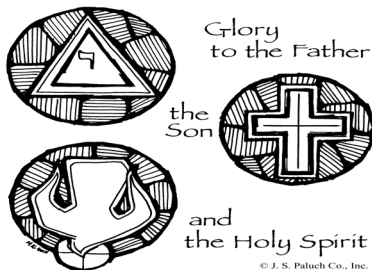
