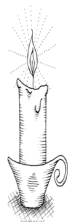

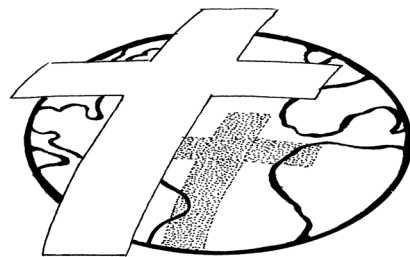

Pastor's Column June 28 - 29, 2014

All Roads Lead to Rome



This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, the two great Princes of the Apostles who both made their way to Rome and who were both martyred in that city around the year 64 during the persecution of the Church initiated by the Emperor Nero.

Tradition tells us that Peter was crucified with his head downward because he did not believe himself worthy enough to die in the same manner as Christ. The crucifixion took place in sight of an ancient Egyptian obelisk in the Circus of Nero which now proudly stands at the center of the square which bears St. Peter's name. He was buried nearby in a grave on the Vatican hill, and some three hundred years later in the Fourth Century AD the Emperor Constantine, who became Christian and who issued the edict that ended the Roman persecution of the Church, ordered the construction of a basilica over that spot. If you ever travel to the Eternal City, make sure you reserve well in advance a Scavi Tour which takes you through the excavations beneath St. Peter's Basilica and recounts the fascinating history of that edifice.

St. Paul, because of his Roman citizenship, could not be crucified. He was beheaded on the Ostian Road just outside of Rome. Tradition says that when it was severed from his body, Paul's head bounced three times and three springs of water surfaced. A church was built over that site, and in the church of San Paolo alle Tre Fontane (St. Paul at the Three Fountains) you can view the waters which flow beneath. Paul's body was buried two miles away from the place of his martyrdom, in the sepulchral area along the Ostiense Way. A marker was erected on it and the site quickly became a place of veneration. The Emperor Constantine also built a basilica on that site, and the basilica was significantly extended by Theodosius I from 386 into what is now known as Saint Paul Outside the Walls, after whose interior our own beautiful church of St. Mark is modeled.

Having lived in Rome for six years during my Theology and Canon Law studies, it is hard not to be nostalgic this time of year with so many ordinations taking place. On Friday, June 27th I celebrate my fifth anniversary as a Priest of Jesus Christ, and I dare say these have been the happiest five years of my life. On Saturday, June 28th Bishop Nicholas DiMarzio will ordain thirteen new priests for the Diocese of Brooklyn, the largest ordination class in the United States this year. It is an achievement for which we should be proud, but it still is not nearly enough for a diocese of our size and the number of priests who retire each year. The Church is built upon Apostolic foundations, and it is the successors to the Apostles, the College of Bishops, and their collaborators, the Priests, who continue to make Christ present for us in the Eucharist. Please pray for all the newly ordained, and pray that God might continue to call young men to serve His Church as Priests, perhaps some from this very parish, and that they might have the courage to say yes. Saint Peter and Saint Paul, pray for us! Fr. Bob
