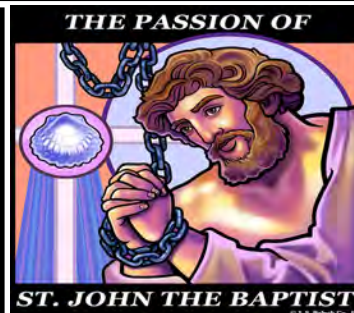
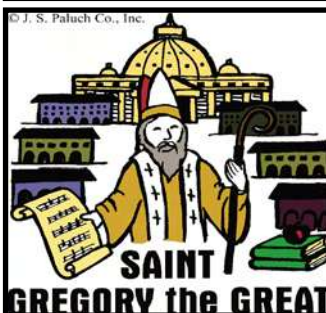

A Lesson in Humility

Praised be Jesus Christ both now and forever! This weekend's Gospel deals with humility. How difficult it is for us to be humble! We live in a world that recognizes importance and superiority by the standard of the world. And the world begins to inflate our pride, our importance, our selfishness, our independence. It creates a system of Us and Them. The world makes us think that because we have reached a certain standard we are better than the rest, and that we need to be catered to or privileged, that our lives are worth more than the lives of others who maybe in the eyes of the world have very little. And so the world thinks that they can be done away with, whether it be the child in the womb, or whether it be the person severely challenged, or maybe the elderly who can no longer care for themselves. Whatever standard the world has created, anything below it is deemed not worthy of respect and hence can be done away with. So, this arrogance begins to fester and grow in every person, and it allows them to believe this should be the only standard, and to recognize any other is a threat to you so they need to be done away with. It is the supreme arrogance!

Let me tell you a story, and this is a true story that happened to me. I have the good fortune of having spent eight years in Rome, Italy, the best time of my life. Besides that, I had the tremendous privilege, and truly the most humbling in my life, to be ordained a priest by a saint, Pope Saint John Paul II. It was an awesome day! Too bad it was so overwhelming it seems like I wasn't there. But pictures do tell me the story. So, it is customary in the first two three months you are invited to different pontifical liturgies. They would tell you when you got there where the priests would vest and line up, and where the Bishops would go, and where the Cardinals would go, and everybody had their place. It was a very humbling experience. I always tried to hide and not be in the limelight, especially being a big guy.

Well this particular day, I vested and went with all the other priests, and at one moment the priest who was in charge of ceremonies came over to me and said to me, "You need to go to the front of the line." I said to him, "I think you're making a mistake," but I said to myself, "Who am I? I'm nobody. He is the one who's in charge of all the ceremonies. How can I question it?" But I did. And he said to me, Just go, there's a place for you. So, I get to the front and there's another place, and they said, "Okay father, you stand here." I start to realize I'm standing directly behind the Bishops. So all of a sudden a Cardinal, who is very influential Cardinal, comes up to me and says, "What are you doing here? You belong in the back of the line." So very sheepishly I said, "Yes your Eminence," kissed his ring, and went to the back of the line. When I got there, I was told once again by the same priest in charge of ceremonies, "Please go to the front of the line." I tried to explain to him, but he says, "I don't want to hear anything, just go where I tell you and be obedient." So, I did, and the exact same thing happened again, with this Cardinal asking me if I was dumb. I said, "No, your Eminence," once again kissed his ring and ran to the back of the line. At this point, the same priest who sent me to the front said to me, "Why do you keep coming back here? I sent you to the front of the line." He gave me a moment to explain. He took me by the hand literally and brought me to the front of the line. When we got to the front of the line, we met the Cardinal who was very influential, and he said to him, Your Eminence, with all due respect and humility, this priest was ordained by His Holiness. He has a place of privilege in the line." The Cardinals turned around and walked away and I was there in the front.

It always puzzles me that Bishops and Cardinals and Priests and Sisters have such arrogance and have lost all humility, and yet they follow a person who embodied humility to the ninth degree. It's a contradiction. And so my dear friends, the example we must have is that of the humble servant named Jesus, who washed feet, who sat with sinners, who ate with prostitutes. He associated with the outcasts. He raised up the lowly and brought them to high places. Humility is seen with tremendous favor before God's face.
